Sponsor: If you have trouble sourcing a baptismal cross and candle, let me know and we can try to help out. We have candles.

Baptismal Cross

According to tradition, the baptismal cross must be an Orthodox Cross. Either a plain cross (without the crucified corpus) or a crucifix (cross with corpus that has feet individually nailed, not one on top of the other).

Change of underclothes and a towel.

When it comes time for the catechumen to be immersed 3 times in the font, the catechumen should wear at least a t-shirt and shorts on top of their underclothes.

Once the newly-illuminated emerges for the final time from the baptismal waters, they will go to the office in back of the church to dry themselves and change into dry clothes.

After that, the newly illumined will be given the white baptismal tunic to wear for the rest of the baptism and also during the liturgy on the following day.

Re: Honourarium to Cathedral
